

Excerpt from Christ Our Pascha

The Holy Spirit Revealed in the Holy Scriptures

From the first sentences of the Book of Genesis, "the Spirit of God" is the image used to signify the living God (*Gn 1:2*). In the account of the creation of humankind, the Holy Scriptures mention the "breath of life", which God "breathed into" the man, who then became a "living being" (*see Gn 2:7*). In the Old Testament, many other images are brought forth as examples that in the New Testament become symbols of the Holy Spirit: "rivers of living water" (*Jn 7:38*), "anointing" (*1 Jn 2:20, 27*), "fire of purification" and "tongues of fire" (*Lk 3:16; Acts 2:3*), "wind" (Jn 3:8; Acts 2:2), "seal of anointing on us" (*2 Cor 1:22; Eph 1:13; Eph 4:30*), the laying on of hands (*see Acts 6:6; Acts 8:17-19*), and "dove" (*Mt 3:16*).
